



## 2019 Feeder Watch Data Sheet (February 15, 16, or 17, 2019)

Record the **maximum** number of each species seen during the day. For example -- you saw 6 Blue Jays at 8:00 a.m., 4 at noon, 2 at 2:00 p.m., and 6 more at 4:00. You record 6 Blue Jays for the day as the maximum number seen. This may result in undercounting jays, but will avoid counting the same birds twice.
