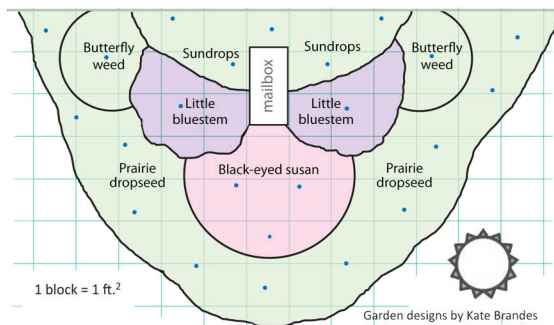

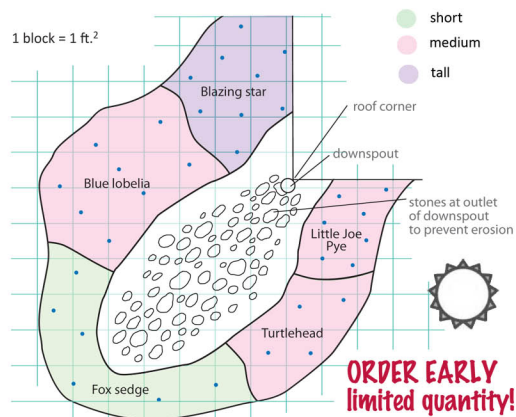

Penn State Master Gardeners are partnering with Lehigh Gap Nature Center to introduce native plants into the home landscape.

The *Mailbox Garden* and *Downspout Garden* shown in the illustration are being offered for sale as a kit.

Order now for Fall delivery and planting.

Plants are plug size, about three inches in diameter and will mature over time. All plants in the kit are native perennial plants. Perennial plants regrow each year in contrast to annuals that must be replanted every year. Since native perennials have evolved in our climatic zone they generally require less maintenance.
