


Plant plugs are first year seedlings. With fall planting, the plugs have an opportunity to develop deep roots in native soil and become healthy plants. Generally, the plants are less expensive than fully mature plants.



# Order now for Fall delivery and planting.

Plants are plug size, about three inches in diameter and will mature over time. All plants in the kit are native perennial plants. Perennial plants regrow each year in contrast to annuals that must be replantd every year. Since native perennials have evolved in our climatic zone they generally require less maintenance.
